Organization Background

GRT, an Italian NGO founded in 1968, specializes in mental health, psychosocial support, child protection, gender-based violence, and forced migration. With extensive experience working with vulnerable communities across Africa, Asia, South America, and Europe, GRT ensures culturally sensitive interventions by collaborating with local communities. Since 1996, GRT has been active in Kenya and Somalia, focusing on Community Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MHPSS), Protection (GBV, Child Protection, and Forced Migration).

Consultancy Framework

"Women Empowerment and Environment and Health Support" (IMARISHA MWANAMKE, AFYA NA RASLIMALI) is a three-year project funded by the Italian Agency for Development Cooperation (AICS) and implemented by a consortium of five partner NGOs, led by WeWorld. Implemented in Narok County, it addresses education, Gender-Based Violence (GBV) prevention and response, and Adolescents Sexual Reproductive Health Rights (ASRHR) services. The project covers four sub-counties, and 20 hotspot areas identified within.

The initiative aims to foster social and political changes through awareness-raising activities and strengthening the capacity of civil society to advocate for and provide GBV services. Technical support will be given to key stakeholders for gender policy implementation, and capacity building will be conducted for community workers on ASRH, GBV topics and referral pathways.

GRT seeks a GBV and SRH professional to develop an ASRH training manual customized for Narok County. The consultant will update existing training materials and consolidate them into a manual for adolescents, young women, parents and teachers. The manual will also enhance the capacity of the County Health authorities (including the Ministry of Health, the Department of SRH, the SRH Technical Working Group) in planning, coordinating, and monitoring ASRHR services.

Workshops with adolescents, students and the Adolescent Council organized jointly by GRT and WeWorld will ensure youth perspectives are included. GRT staff will design and conduct the workshops



liaising with the consultant guidelines and inputs, whilst the consultant will structure the manual, populate it with relevant and contextualized contents and oversee final edits before printing and dissemination with the County Steering Group and CSOs.

Additionally, the consultant will gamify parts of the training materials for adolescents and students in schools. This approach is grounded in evidence demonstrating that interactive and play-based learning enhances engagement, comprehension and long-term retention of knowledge.

Context Background

Despite a favorable gender equality legal framework, gender inequalities persist, particularly in pastoralist and agro-pastoralist communities in arid and semi-arid lands (ASAL). Narok County has the highest reported cases of Sexual Gender-Based Violence (SGBV), Female Genital Mutilation (FGM), and early pregnancies among ASAL counties.

- 42.46% of women (15-49 years old) have experienced violence, exceeding the national average (35.8%).
- 28% of girls (15-19 years old) have had at least one pregnancy.
- 51% of women (15-49 years old) have undergone FGM.

Official data show underreporting of violence cases, with only 40 cases reported to the police in 2023, while health authorities recorded 135 cases. Currently, only child protection policies are being discussed at the county level, while gender equality, GBV, and anti-FGM policies remain unimplemented.

<u>Policy Alignment</u>: The project aligns with Narok's Draft CIDP III 2023-2027, Narok County Gender Policy (2022), FGM Eradication Policy (2022), and national policies such as the National ASRH Policy (2015) and the National Reproductive Health Policy (2022-2032).

Objective of the Consultancy

The consultancy aims to review existing SRH materials at county level and develop a contextappropriate manual for Narok County and for the identified target populations.

Specific Objectives:

- Identify key topics for updating SRH materials.
- Establish objectives and roadmap in consultation with county SRH and Gender departments.
- Present quarterly drafts in revision workshops.
- Include gamifying of identified topics presented in the manual.
- Compile, edit, and validate the manual.
- Finalize the manual for printing and dissemination.

Implementation Methodology

The consultant will begin by reviewing the existing materials on SRH, along with the relevant SRH and GBV policies in place in Narok County, to identify key topics and content for the manual. A crucial aspect of this manual's development is the integration of gaming and gamification as a core methodology throughout the



whole manual, in its specific different modules to enhance engagement and learning effectiveness. The manual must include <u>clearly outlined and updated SRH materials</u> contextualized for Narok County.

Before the first quarterly revision workshop with the SRH Department in August, the consultant will submit a first draft of the manual to GRT. This will allow GRT staff to present it during the workshop for an initial round of revisions. The process of continuous revision and updating will extend until April 2026, during which the consultant will refine the training materials, ensuring that gamification remains relevant while incorporating feedback from adolescents and key stakeholders through quarterly review workshops and co-design sessions. The Adolescent Council workshops will ensure youth perspectives are integrated.

GRT will facilitate engagement with schools, as well as national and county-level authorities. Final edits will be completed before printing and dissemination, which will take place through a County Steering Group event and other outreach initiatives.

Expected Output

• Final validated SRH training manual ready for dissemination.
